A. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The programme Domestic and gender-based violence implemented within the Norway grants 2014-2021 is focused on the programme objective "Domestic and gender-based violence prevented and victims protected and assisted". The programme supports projects within 2 Programme Areas – "Work-life Balance" and "Domestic and Gender-based Violence".

The first programme area Work-life Balance is implemented through the Outcome 1 Understanding of gender equality increased and 1 pre-defined project. The Open call DGV01 (Small Grant Scheme) was launched on 18^{th} July 2019 with the aim to support organizations promoting equality between women and men and work life balance. Within the first round closure there have been 8 project applications submitted in the total amount of ≤ 1 445 616. Total allocation for the Open call DGV01 is ≤ 1 440 000. After the evaluation process 7 applications out of the total amount of 8 submitted project applications are going to be reviewed by the Selection committee. The Selection Committee meeting on the Open call DGV01 will be held held on 8^{th} January 2020. Afterwards, the project contracts shall be concluded approximately by the end of April 2020. The pre-defined project DGVPP001 "HER STORY" supporting the Outcome 1 focuses on combating the impact of gender stereotypes and inequalities on society through education and awareness–raising is going to be implemented by the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the SR. Its eligibility of costs started in August 2019 and the project contract will be signed at the beginning of 2020.

The Programme Area Domestic and Gender-based Violence is implemented through the Outcome 2 and 3 and 1 pre-defined project. To the Outcome 2 *Victims of domestic and gender-based violence protected and supported two open calls* shall contribute. Call no. 1 (DGV02) will support intervention teams at local level on services for victims of domestic and gender-based violence, including children and Call no. 2 (DGV03) will support the improvement of the quality of the services so that they meet the required standards, including specific services for children victims.

Outcome 3 *Response systems to victims of domestic and gender-based violence improved* shall be implemented through the Call no. 3 (DGV04) that will support the specialization of services targeted at vulnerable groups, such as victims with addictions, victims of sexual abuse, as well as perpetrators of violence. At this moment calls DGV02 and DGV03 are being prepared by the Programme Operator and will be launched within the first half of 2020. The call DGV04 is planned to be launched in the second half of 2020. The pre-defined project DGVPP002 "Improving the victim-oriented approach – a tool enhancing the capacity to fight violence against women and domestic violence" supporting fulfilling the Outcome 3 will be implemented by the Institute for Labour and Family research. This pre-defined project continues and strengthens the work of the Coordinating Methodical Centre (CMC) to develop, implement and coordinate a comprehensive national policy on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence, in line with the Council of Europe Convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence to start at the beginning of 2020 and the project contract will be signed afterwards.

The Programme Operator organized the Launching conference of the Domestic and genderbased violence programme in February 2019 which took place in Hotel Bôrik, Bratislava. The conference was held in the attendance of 90 participants from across Slovakia working within the issue of domestic and gender-based violence and work-life balance, representatives from the donor programme partner – the Norwegian Directorate of Health, representatives from the international partner organization – the Council of Europe, representatives from the programme partner – the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic and representatives from the Royal Norwegian Embassy in Bratislava.

B. PERFORMANCE

1. Results

Bilateral Outcome: Enhanced collaboration between beneficiary and donor state entities involved in the programme

The Programme Operator launched the Open Call DGVBF01 for bilateral relations for establishing and development of the partnership - Support of organizations promoting equality between women and men and work life balance on the 4^{th} of June 2019. The Call is aimed at entities, which are planning to apply for a grant within the Call DGV01 on support of organizations promoting equality between women and men and work life balance. The total allocation of the call is ≤ 10000 .

Within the call 5 grant applications for bilateral initiatives have been received. 3 of the total 5 grant applications received have been approved with the total allocation of € 5 377.

A bilateral initiative DGVBFPI-01 with the title "KMC meeting with the donor partner of the predefined project and active participation at the 3rd European Conference on Domestic Violence" was implemented in September 2019. The main aim of this bilateral initiative was the meeting of the KMC and its donor project partner - Norwegian Centre for Violence and Traumatic Stress Studies in Oslo to discuss outstanding issues of the prepared predefined project DGVPP002. At the same time the Project Promoter also actively participated in the 3rd European Conference on Domestic Violence in Oslo, Norway. The bilateral initiative DGVBFPI-01 was completed and will be financially settled at the beginning of 2020.

On 6th November 2019 the Programme Operator submitted the Expression of Interest for the Domestic and Gender-based Violence Programme to request additional funding from the Bilateral Fund (aside of the funds allocated within the Memorandum of Understanding) in the amount of \notin 90 000. This amount covers pre-defined initiatives to be implemented by the PO (\notin 55 000) and via Open call (\notin 35 000).

Cooperation with the Donor Programme Partner

The Domestic and gender-based violence Programme has one Donor Programme Partner – the Norwegian Directorate of Health. The Programme Operator very much appreciates this continued excellent cooperation with the Donor Programme Partner after the successful

cooperation within the previous implementation phase of Norwegian Financial Mechanism 2009-2014.

Within the Domestic and gender-based violence Programme 2014-2021 the Programme Operator organized 7 Cooperation Committee Meetings, 3 Cooperation Committee meetings out of them were proceeded per-rollam. The agenda of the held Cooperation Committee meetings was the setting of the DGV01 call, plan of the bilateral funds using, status of the predefined project within the programme, approval of the Rules of Procedures of the Selection committee and the general programme status. The next Cooperation Committee meeting is planned on 9th January 2020 in connection with the Selection Committee meeting to be held the day before.

Outcome 1 – Understanding of gender equality increased

Pre-defined projects

Under the Outcome 1 the Predefined project DGVPP001 "HER STORY" is being implemented. The project aims to combat the impact of gender stereotypes and inequalities on society through education and awareness-raising. It will strengthen the capacity of teachers on gender mainstreaming in education and increase the knowledge among young people on gender equality and women's rights. After a positive assessment of the PDP by the PO, the eligibility period of the project started in September 2019.

The project contract is supposed to be concluded in January 2020.

Pre-defined projects

There will be no predefined projects implemented within the Outcome 2.

Outcome 3– Response systems to victims of domestic and gender-based violence improved

No Open call will contribute to the Outcome 3.

Pre-defined projects

Two Predefined projects were planned to be implemented under this outcome. The DGVPP002 (PDP2) "Improving the victim-oriented approach – a tool enhancing the capacity to fight violence against women and domestic violence" will be implemented by the Project Promoter Institute for Labour and Family Research. The Project application to this predefined project was submitted at the end of October 2019 and assessment of the predefined project is supposed to be concluded within the 1st quarter of 2020.

The third Predefined project "Awareness raising and enhancement of the capacity to fight violence against women in Slovakia in line with Council of Europe standards" (PDP3) was planned to be implemented by the International Programme Organization – the Council of Europe. Unfortunately, the predefined project will not be implemented because the Council of Europe is not in a position to pursue the relevant predefined project in the capacity of project promoter.

At this moment there are discussions in progress with the Project Promoter of the DGVPP002 on taking over some of the originally planned activities within the PDP3. A Programme Agreement modification will be prepared by the PO after conclusion of the discussion.

2. Implementation

Conformity with specific requirements

General conditions:

1. The maximum level of funding available from the total eligible expenditure of the programme for infrastructure (hard measures) shall be 30% - this condition shall be fulfilled. The Programme Operator has taken it into account during the call preparation. It will also be a subject to the Programme Operator verification during the project contracts concluding

2. The relevant public institution(s) in the Slovak Republic in charge of the policy area in question, including the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family, shall be actively involved in the implementation of the programme, specifically as member(s) of the Cooperation Committee. The Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family shall be a voting member at the Selection Committee subject to the absence of any conflict of interest - this condition has already been fulfilled. Norwegian Financial Mechanism 2014 – 2021. At the same time the Institute of Labour and Family Research, particularly Coordinating Methodical Centre for domestic and gender-based violence, is a member of the Cooperation Committee, as well as a voting member of the Selection Committee for the component of domestic and gender-based violence.

3. For Outcome 1 indicators "Share of population (targeted by awareness-raising activities) favourable to gender equality (disaggregated by gender)", Share of population (targeted by awareness-raising activities) that reject gender stereotyping", Share of students (in targeted schools) favourable to gender equality (disaggregated by gender)" and "Share of students (in targeted schools) rejecting gender stereotyping", where the baseline value is "to be determined", (TBD), the National Focal Point shall ensure that the Programme Operator submits to the FMO the baseline value, together with a description of the data collection method used, no later than 6 months after the finalisation of the selection of projects under the Small Grant Scheme. The updated baseline value shall be agreed upon through a modification of the programme agreement – in line with the Open call DGV01 within all the supported projects a survey shall be conducted (at the beginning and at the end of the project activities implementation) in order to identify all the listed Outcome 1 indicators, their baseline and target values pursuant to the instruction of the Programme Operator.

4. For the Outcome 2 indicator "Share of supported counselling centres meeting CoE standards", where the baseline value is "to be determined" (TBD), the National Focal Point shall ensure that the programme Operator submits to the FMO the baseline value, together with a description of the data collection method used, no later than 6 months after the finalisation of the selection of the projects under the last relevant call for proposals. The updated baseline value shall be agreed upon through a modification of the programme agreement - the condition will be fulfilled after the relevant calls closures. The relevant calls are planned to be launched in 2020.

5. For the Outcome 3 indicator "Level of satisfaction of institutions and organisations involved in the response systems with the effectiveness of the response system", where the baseline value is "to be determined" (TBD), the national Focal Point shall ensure that the Programme Operator submits to the FMO for approval the baseline value, together with a description of the data collection method used, no later than 6 month after the signature of the contract for the pre-defined project no. 2 (numbering under Section 5.1 of Annex II to the Programme Agreement). The updated baseline value shall be agreed upon through a modification of the programme agreement - the condition will be fulfilled after the signature of the project contract for the pre-defined project no. 2 which is supposed to be done in first half of 2020.

6. The National Focal Point shall ensure that the Programme Operator informs and coordinates any relevant activities with the Fund Operator of the Active Citizens Fund – Slovakia in order to seek and achieve synergies – the PO cooperates with the Fund Operator of the Active Citizens Fund within the preparation phase of the Open calls in order to avoid the same focus of the Open calls. The PO is also in touch with the Fund Operator regarding the publicity and information activities.

Cooperation with International Partner Organisations (IPOs)

Within the Domestic and gender-based Violence Programme the Programme Operator cooperates with the Council of Europe (CoE). The PO very much appreciates the continued cooperation with the Council of Europe and the benefits from this partnership.

C. LEARNING

1. Monitoring

Forasmuch as there have been no project contracts signed during 2019 no monitoring has been conducted.

2. Evaluation

Forasmuch as there have been no project contracts signed during 2019 any evaluation has been conducted.

3. Lessons learned

Based on our experience the PO considers very important to have timeline and to agree on the meetings and other events with the DPP, IPO and other programme partners or members of the Selection Committee etc. in sufficient time. For instance regarding the calls we have agreed in the Cooperation Committee to agree on the date of the Selection Committee meeting within 10 working days after the closure on the calls based on the number of the project applications submitted. This is very much appreciated mainly by partners involved in more programmes such CoE (IPO), DPP and other programme partners. For planning the meetings it is also important to state the preliminary time for discussion on the individual items. Based on this the length of the meeting can be more accurately estimated. Within the meetings it is important not only to agree on the activities, but also on the next steps and timeline. Generally planning is very important phase and even though it takes longer it makes the next steps and further phases more efficient.

Meetings and consultation with the relevant stakeholders, including decision makers, partners, experts, and target groups and providing information them within individual steps it is also very important. This is a challenge the PO would like to improve within this programme period.

Annex 2: Communication summary

a. Visibility of the Grants and the donors

The Communication plan of the Domestic and gender-based violence programme has been elaborated. As the Programme Operator acts in line with this document it is not necessary to update the approved Communication plan in 2019 as it will be updated if necessary but at least once a year in accordance with the Annual Programme Report. The Programme Operator communicates its dissemination and publicity activities with Royal Norwegian Embassy to Slovakia and the Press Department of the Government Office of SR.

In line with the agreed obligations under the communication plan the Programme Operator organized an Launching conference for the DGV programme on 27th February 2019 with the attendance of 90 participants from across Slovakia working within the issue of domestic and gender-based violence and work-life balance, representatives from the DPP – Norwegian Directorate of Health, representatives from the IPO – Council of Europe, representatives from the programme partner – the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Family of the Slovak Republic and representatives from the Royal Norwegian Embassy in Bratislava. The Launching conference was aimed to inform about the programme, its pre-defined projects, planned open calls, events and to raise awareness about the Norway grants in Slovakia. Expert discussion on the apppropriate setting of the selection criteria for the area of provision of support services to victims of domestic and gender-based violnece was part of the Launching Conference.

The Programme Operator also manages and maintains a website www.eeagrants.sk where all the up to date programme information are published in Slovak and English language.

Regarding the DGV01 call the Government Office of the SR as the Programme Operator organized an Information day on 25th June 2019 in Banská Bystrica. Also a representative of the DPP, Mrs. Pernille V. Dehli attended this event and introduced the role of the DPP within the Programme. The aim of this event was to introduce the call to the potential applicants and answer their possible questions.

Additionally the PO ensures that the beneficiaries and their partners fulfill their information and publicity obligations in accordance with the Regulations and the Publicity and Information Requirements in Annex 3 as this condition is set out in the project contract.

b. Communication with the National Focal Point

The Programme Operator is a member of the communication network of the National Focal Point. The Programme Operator closely cooperates and coordinates its activities with the National Focal Point and the Royal Norwegian Embassy to Slovakia to ensure that actual, clear and detailed information on the Programme is provided for all target groups. The communication between the Programme Operator and the National Focal Point is nearly on the daily basis depending on the issue that is to be discussed. The NFP is also an observer in the Cooperation Committee therefore it is aware of any proposals or changes that are to be discussed/implemented. Annex 2 of this APR is also submitted to the Strategic Actions Unit of EEA and Norway Grants for comments and discussion.

c. Website and social media

The Domestic and gender-based violence Programme webpage is a subpage of the national single web page for both FMs, managed by the NFP, hyperlinking via both addresses www.eeagrants.sk and www.norwaygrants.sk.

From the technical point of view, all information (for example about Calls or News) are automatically hyper-linked to main webpages generating this kind of information about all Calls or News under programmes implemented. This is why the PO can provide only general values of visits for main websites www.eeagrants.sk and www.norwaygrants.sk. Generally from the signature of Programme Agreement in November 2018 there were 56 232 visits recorded on the website www.eeagrants.sk / www.norwaygrants.sk including 20% returning visitors (recorded according to unique IP addresses) and 80% new web visitors. In terms of methodology and statistics it is not relevant information value if the Programme Operator provides real number of visitors and other relevant numbers only in relation to visiting of programme sub-webpage.

The webpage is being operated in national language (Slovak) and in English. The NFP administers a profile on Facebook under the title "Granty EHP a Nórska na Slovensku", where all major information of the Programme is published (in accordance to the internal rules of the PO/NFP's organization).

With regards to the DGV Programme content the Communication Strategy focuses on the local and regional media as well as the national media and by all types of media (press, radio, TV, social media, website). The particular media is communicated in the co-operation with the PR Department and Press Department of the Government Office of SR and the press news for each communication activity is prepared ad-hoc.

Together 6 news (4 in English version) were published on the website www.eeagrants.sk and on Facebook page "Granty EHP a Nórska na Slovensku" regarding the DGV programme in 2019, namely on the information about the Launching conference of the programme, status of the

programme, the information about the Information day and Match-making event in Banská Bystrica related to the DGV01 Open call, the launch of the DGV01 Open call, bilateral call DGVBF01 and the information in the closure of the first DGV01 Open call round.

As regards the information about the launch of the DGV01 Open call, besides using website and Facebook for spreading information on the launch of the call, the PO after the discussion with the Strategic Actions Unit of EEA and Norway Grants and the Press Department of the Government office of the SR, decided to use press media as well, at the local as well as at the national scale, in order to reach as much potential applicants and project partners as possible.

The Programme Operator considers social media to be a very useful and appropriate tool, thanks to which the PO can reach our target groups with the necessary information very quickly and effectively.
